School Performance Plan – school goals and annual revision Each year our school conducts a review and revision of our school performance plan (SPP). The SPP process involves an analysis of student achievement and growth data, teacher professional development needs, and parent input into parent involvement programs. Our school goals for the current school year are outlined as follows:

Goal 1	CCMES will increase the level of all students' growth and proficiency in English Language Arts by using high leverage instructional strategies with the Nevada Academic Content Standards (NVACS) by the end of the 2016-2017 school year. We will be using Balanced Literacy, high levels of cognitive demand, differentiating instruction, and ongoing collaboration and professional development as measured by observational data and standardized/common assessment data.
Goal 2	CCMES will increase the level of all students' growth and proficiency and in math by using high leverage instructional strategies with the Nevada Academic Content Standards (NVACS) by the end of the 2017-2018 school year. We will be using the eight mathematical practices, increasing the level of cognitive demand, differentiating instruction, and ongoing collaboration and professional development as measured by observational data and standardized/common assessment data.
Goal 3	C.C. Meneley will implement tier three and continue tiers one and two Positive Behavioral Support framework school-wide to improve the safe learning environment, create a positive school climate, and increase the social emotional learning (SEL) of all students.
